Answer each question in turn, use the code breaker and decipher the word. Give the secret word to Eltham Park South café and enjoy! This number/ counting activity is suitable for the family and requires adult support.

At Crafty Wizards Pre-Schools we aim to make learning magical through creativity, we hope that you have fun and learn a little about Eltham Park South. Now get cracking!

Beginning by the green information board, at the start of the blossom path from Glenesk Road that leads to Eltham South café. Take a look at the information board about Eltham Park South and find out all about its history. Did you know there was a train line from Blackheath to Dartford via Eltham opened in 1895?

1. How many wheels can you count on the picture of a train on the information board?

Walk down the path and turn left, you will see another Eltham Park South information board.

2. There used to be a lido (open air swimming pool) here. What date in April 1924 was it opened?

Stroll on down to the outdoor gym.

3. How many stations are there to lock up your bike?

Follow the path to the end and turn right. Look up at the lampposts, there are numbers on top of them every so often. Continue along, before you get to the bend in the path, on your right you will find an area under a tree which can be a fun hide out den.

4. What number is at the top of the lamppost nearest the hide out den?

Follow the path.

5. On the bend, how many bollards are there?

Continue down the path until you get to the signposts.

6. What is the highest number that you can see on the signposts?

You could walk to Richmond... Continue around Eltham Park South field. Can you spot a wooden post with the Green chain walk and Capital ring sign on it?

7. What colour is the arrow? How many letters in this colour?

Keep on plodding down the path, on the right you will find a tree surrounded in rainbows and bright pictures.

8. Let's sing "I can sing a Rainbow". How many colours are in this song?

It's down hill from here! Did you know it's a mile around Eltham Park South. It's good to get a mile in a day! Same time tomorrow?

9. How many large metal storage containers can you count?

Nearly there, your target the tennis courts...

10. How many tennis courts can you count (not lawn tennis)?

Continue towards Eltham Park South Café. If you have a dog it can take a rest and have a drink. Well done you have walked a mile!

11. How many dog bowls are there?
